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that mean those two have to be in the Mountain time zone? I have concerns about that. If it said, in fact, if we said just the opposite and we said eight casino locations of which no more than five...of which...of which five shall be in the Eastern time zone, then I would worry about whether we could have any casino in the Mountain time zone until we had had five in the Central time zone. I said Eastern, Central time zone. So I think...I think we want to be careful, very careful about the words that we put in the constitution and think about how limiting or how unintended consequences could result from those words. And I get what you're saying entirely. And if this body wanted to assure that if we had any casinos there was going to be at least one in the Mountain time zone, there would be a way to word that, perhaps. Or maybe there's a way to word it and do what you're saying, but...I don't know if you follow me, but I'm having trouble thinking about the legal implications and interpretation of the wording in the constitution if we say three of which shall be in the Mountain time zone. So I would...I would...I'll give you what time I have left. I have one other small point to make. And once again, if this debate centers on whether we should have gambling and casinos in Nebraska or whether we shouldn't, I think...I think we're missing the boat here. The question is, how is the best way to put something before the people so the people could decide this once and for all; how is the best method to do that? I think the best method is by you. I think you can craft the best proposal and let the people decide and that's...I think that then we're doing a service to the people of the state by doing that. Senator Louden, I would yield whatever time I have left to you to hopefully respond to my concerns about the language.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Louden, you have about one minute, plus you have the next five minutes, so you have six minutes.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Okay. Thank you, Senator Bromm. Well, your point is well taken and I'll just discuss the part that you've...that you've mentioned here. And as a degreed lawyer, such as you, I'm sure you're probably correct on some of the language in this legal jargon. What I'm looking at is in the wording above it. It says, as authorized by the Legislature. So I presume the Legislature has still got control over where
