SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute

SENATOR SMITH: ...is certainly a vote to promote expanded gambling. The petition, as we've heard, is so extreme, it would be a lot easier to defeat that, if you're against expanded gambling in Nebraska. And if you're not against expanded gambling in Nebraska, certainly, knock yourself out, in terms of putting something on the ballot. But if you're against expanded gambling in Nebraska, it's much easier to battle against something that is ridiculous than it is to battle against something that's certainly more palatable, at least at first glance. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I rise...(laugh) I'm halfway tempted, Senator Louden, to just support it, because I heard Senator Schimek say that this could kill the bill. So I'm halfway supportive...halfway interested in supporting your amendment. Nonetheless, I will digress a little bit. I'd like to ask Senator Schimek a question or two, if I may.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, would you yield to a question from Senator Erdman?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Senator Schimek, you mentioned in your first speech in opposition to Senator Louden's amendment that you foresee maybe one or two large, whatever kind of definition you want to use there, casinos...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Destination kind of casinos.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Yeah.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.
