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SENATOR ERDMAN: Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And maybe that's what we should do (laugh), is put those all over the state. I'm just kidding.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Maybe we could put them all in your district.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Just kidding. No. (Laugh)

SENATOR ERDMAN: All right. Thank you very much, Senator Schimek. I appreciate the attempt that's going on here. And I actually have filed an amendment that I believe is a friendly amendment to the proposal. And it's out of trepidation that I do that, because I don't want to do something that I think helps something, but I think if we're going to be serious about this, we should be that way, and we should approach it from that way. And I worried some people that I offer a floor amendment to a constitutional amendment. But I think there is an opportunity to clarify some things. And I think from the standpoint of what we're trying to accomplish here is probably something in philosophy that might work, but in reality probably won't. Again, there is no guarantee that what we put out there the people of the state of Nebraska are going to vote for. Remember, they voted for term limits, so there's a little bit of disdain about how we do things here in the first place. But there's no guarantee that if there are five competing amendments out there, that LR 14CA comes across the finish line first. Because I don't know who the interests are behind Senator Schimek's proposal here, I don't know if the casinos who really want to come to Nebraska are going to put up the tens of hundreds of thousands of dollars, potentially millions of dollars, to support this, over those groups that are supporting the other petitions. We don't know what's going to happen there. I guess the other argument could be, well, let's give them a shot. However, I think it's a little shortsighted to say that we're here trying to do something that we can say would be better than what's out there when we cannot guarantee that what would be passed by this Legislature would be what we would govern under. So we also need to point that out as well. Again, the control issue is only given to the Legislature in the situation that whatever the body puts on the ballot,...
