the Constitution of the State of Nebraska. These definitions and this verbiage and all of this language makes the sportsmen's constitutional amendment look like a really good deal. Senator Schrock should bring that back to us here while we're dealing with this one, so he can have a favorable comparison for his. In any event, what are games of chance? Games of chance means any games which have the elements of chance, prize or wager, including any wage to a slot machine, table game, counter game or card game. The only thing that's excluded is it shall not include any game the operation of which at a casino is prohibited by the laws of the United States. Well, there aren't many like that, so that's not a very serious limitation. So basically, obviously, it includes slot machines, and I suppose that that's the big item for most of us, that there are these slot machines at which it's very easy to lose money rapidly, and that these are being authorized. And going back to the original phrase of the proposition, it says a community may authorize the operation of games of chance only at permitted locations. Well, that seems to sound very good at first because it's only at permitted locations. So we're probably looking at some very limited group of locations, right? Well, again, they do have a definition of permitted locations, and it's a four-part definition that takes half a page and it says, permitted locations are as follows: Regarding a casino,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...well, now they've added casinos. So, before we can get into this definition of a permitted location and understand it, we need to know what a casino is under the definition of this amendment. Let me give you that definition and then we can speculate on it soon. Casino means a hotel in this state which has no less than 500 hotel rooms. I guess we don't like the small businessperson anymore, right? We're going to...if you are going to have a casino, you got to be big. I guess you can have slot machines in a small place, but if it's a casino, it's got to be a hotel; can't even be a big business that's just a gambling business. It has to be a hotel.
