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what you were asking. And at the time I prioritized LR 14CA, I, at that point, didn't know that I was going to do anything differently than going with the language that was already in LR 14CA. But I also knew that we couldn't continue having different points of view on this; that at some point there had to be a coalescence around one idea. And so at that point, I sat down with some people who've been involved in this issue since day one and we talked about it, and I finally became convinced that the more...the broader language in...actually in Senator Janssen's bill was probably what we needed to do to bring everybody together. And I also realized that I don't want...ever want eight casinos in the state.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: But I also know that it will be up to the Legislature to make that decision if the people make the decision in November. And I hope that I am back here next year. There's no guarantees of that. There's no guarantees for anybody, but we'll basically all be back here next year. We will be the ones who will be dealing with the rules and the regulation and the process, and at that time, you know, we can have our disagreements about the details. But we will at least have the authorization from the people who tell us that's what they want us to do. And at that point, I guess it makes a lot more sense to really slug through those details. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. While we are on the addiction problem, there has always been, since the beginning of time, people who are addicted to some type of gaming. You go back to biblical times. You know, we have...archeologists have uncovered caves and so on through their diggings and they've found the...something that it's similar to a pair of dice or chicken bones or something like that that even primitive people have devised types of games of chance. So this has been around a long time, and I would imagine that there was addiction at that time also. And I had the same report that I was going to read from Jerry Bauerkemper,
