they are using me for something that I don't really agree with anyway. But as I've tried to listen and to evaluate what's going on, and I've had an opportunity to speak to many people, and it was interesting. I was in the Capitol one day when some people were in here from Louisiana. They were from Lake Charles, Louisiana. We were playing McNeese State in football. And I mentioned that I'd been in Lake Charles and how I thought it was a beautiful city and they have a big bridge there that goes over the bay. And I said how beautiful it was, and they said, well, it's not anymore because it's all gambling along there and it's just ruined the whole area. They said it was supposed to do so much for schools and education, and it hasn't done that. And I hear where Iowa is in just as much trouble with education and funds as we are in Nebraska. So it has not helped that much. Many of the supporters are the Las Vegas or Louisiana casinos that drain money out of the state. We're always worried about money going out of the state. Much of that would go out of the state. One thing I keep hearing about is people are so adamant to make sure that we do get some money into the compulsive gambling fund. And I think it's kind of like if you...why don't we give a loaded gun to our kids and say it's okay as long as we have an ambulance sitting beside that we can take care of that. But because it is a problem, and to say that there is not going to be any more compulsive gamblers seems kind of ridiculous. Because if we don't entice more people to gamble with eight more casinos, they're all going to go broke. So there has to be a lot more people gambling. We talk about the money that goes to Iowa, to the riverboat gambling there, and if we could take part of that back, say, we would even...we like to compare that we would have just as much as they do. But then if we do, we have to have a lot more people gambling or else we're just cutting in half for both. So I don't think that's legitimate. Somebody just this morning talked to me that they had gone down through Missouri in some area, and I don't even know where it was; said that there's a whole stretch in there that all it is, is casinos and adult book stores, and said it's really a blighted area just because of all that. I have had, since we had this discussion the last year, several people, friends of mine, that said have had family members that have really got caught up in the compulsive gambling. One is a brother who lives in Michigan; lost his family and everything
