So I'm just up to share comments to help with the delay, to help the principal introducers of this amendment and the proposal to filibuster their own bill and delay us from voting. Maybe we could...you know, maybe if we had a call of the house, we could have the Department of Roads clear the roads for whoever you're waiting for, maybe that would help. But since we can't get a call of the house or we can't get a cease debate motion passed, and we're just going to stand here and talk, we might as well talk about whatever. So it's a beautiful day out. There's a lot of snow in the state of Nebraska. Snowing very hard, Senator Schimek says, which probably doesn't bode well for her side in this debate, but it would bode well for the farmers in my district, including myself, if it was snowing there. We'd really enjoy that. But I just wanted to bring up originally that, under our rules, Rule 7, Section 11, that Senator Schimek does have the opportunity to ask the Speaker to take this off the agenda until her constituents or her support arrives. We can proceed on to other things, and then we can come back, because I'm pretty sure they'd put it back on the agenda.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Just a thought, for what it's worth. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Beutler, followed by Senator Stuthman and others.
