with the suppression or the contracting of the ability to enter into an industry. And so that's my interest here. And Senator Stuhr, I'm not trying to be obstructive. I'm simply trying to say, okay, if we have ten cases of hepatitis a year, it makes sense to enact some pretty significant regulations, rules, laws to protect the public. And I'm waiting to hear how many actual cases we have of people being injured, people contracting hepatitis or other blood diseases because of the tattooing or body art industry. And that is my interest. Again, I kind of...any time I see that we add to government, make government bigger, I...it makes my...it gets my attention. And perhaps there's a need for this. Perhaps we should regulate this industry. I don't know. But...and that's what we're trying to explore here, Senator Stuhr. So I'm not trying to be obstructionist; I'm just simply trying to balance whether or not this makes sense, versus the harm that supposedly this industry has. I'm looking at Senator Stuhr's amendment, and it talks about, on page 8, it says a practitioner means a person who performs any or all of the practices of cosmetology, nail technology, esthetics. And then it adds, or electrology...excuse me, it adds, electrology, or body art for compensation, or who performs any or all of the practices of body art. And it appears that what she's doing is making people who do this for free subject to the law as well. Senator Jensen, would you yield to a question?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you. Senator Jensen, are you in support of Senator Stuhr's amendment? I mean, is it a technical amendment to clean up the committee amendment, in your view?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes. Senator Stuhr's amendment, actually, came from HHS.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: And they were asked to...they asked her to do that at this time. That did not come before the committee.
