SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it will apply if there is cargo in the cargo area of a truck which is open in the back. Isn't that true?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is there anything that says the cargo must be secured?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Just common sense.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then your answer to my question is, no, there is nothing that says the cargo needs to be secured.

SENATOR AGUILAR: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Aguilar, if we could rely on common sense, would we need your bill in the first place?

SENATOR AGUILAR: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So common sense is not good enough to prevent the need for your bill, so I don't think common sense is good enough to ensure that cargo will be secured. Would you object to an amendment that said...says all cargo or any other, and we can give off a string of descriptive words, shall be secured?

SENATOR AGUILAR: If children were present?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR AGUILAR: I wouldn't object to that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And that might lead us to other amendments. In other words, how many amendments are you willing to accept in order to try to get this bill?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Well, I intend to oppose the two amendments
