SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Aguilar, it's your contention that the only time there is an accident that harms a young person is if there is a collision with another vehicle. That's what you're saying, isn't it?

SENATOR AGUILAR: In some cases, not all cases.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So why do you even bring up the speed of the other vehicle when this vehicle could run into a car?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Because those are most instances when accidents do happen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could a car...could a truck go out of control and run into a pole and the child be hurt?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Absolutely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could the driver of this unsafe vehicle be distracted and move into the other lane of traffic and cause an accident?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, he could.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Aguilar, is there anything in your bill that prohibits the driver of one of these vehicles who has a child in the unsafe situation from using a cellular phone while driving this unsafe vehicle with this child in the unsafe circumstances?

SENATOR AGUILAR: There is nothing in my bill that says that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would you object to an amendment that would make sure that the driver is attentive? Would you? Would you object to it? Let me make it specific. Would you object to an amendment that would prohibit a driver who has a child in this dangerous set of circumstances from using a cellular phone while operating the vehicle with a child in that set of circumstances?

SENATOR AGUILAR: I would object simply on the grounds that I don't think we could get it passed.
