But before I would agree to a law like this, even though it purports to protect some children, I will oppose it tooth and nail because it affirmatively places other children in unsafe circumstances and there's no liability. The law does that, and that is wrong. And I believe it's going to take me all morning to make that point, and I'm prepared to take all morning. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue, Senator Chambers, and this will be your third time, as you know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, I'm going to continue repeating and repeating and repeating. I'm going to approach this in the way that adults approach students in school--repetition, repetition, repetition.
