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the caravan language and some of that language, actually goes away with Senator Beutler's amendment, but we haven't got there yet.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And would...I'm sorry I'm not up to speed. Tell me what Senator Beutler's amendment does.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Basically, what we're going to do with Senator Beutler's amendment is attach this to the seat belt law...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR AGUILAR: ...and extend the age from 16 to 18. So we will be picking up two more years of...years of age with children. We'll be saving that many more lives with his addition, with his amendment, and looking forward to that when we get there. But...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR AGUILAR: ...Senator Chambers is right, you know, in his argument. I agree with it, but I still think it's better to save some lives and create some less injuries, catastrophic injuries, at this point.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, thank you, Senator Aguilar, and I really do support the purpose of this bill and I'd like to make it as narrow as possible. But I know there are some times you have to do things. I'm not sure you have to do everything you're intending to do here, but I guess that's the purpose of this debate.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thanks.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There are no further lights wishing to speak. Senator Chambers, you are recognized to close on FA1443.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, since my intent is to burn time off the clock, I'm
