SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening on the motion to reconsider the vote taken. Senator Schimek, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Chambers, I'm just a little tiny seagull, but I'm flying over the seashore here, and I don't think that there's really disagreement with you by some of the other parties on this floor. I don't think Senator Aguilar agrees with you. I heard him say he didn't like the exceptions particularly in this bill, but he thought they had to be made. Senator Foley certainly sounds like he agrees with you. I agree with you. Why don't we take these exceptions one by one and delete them from the bill? I've got an...I've got an amendment up there, a motion to amend, that would take out section (a). Let's vote it up or down. Let's see if we can remove them from the bill, and then we can move the bill forward. I mean, the bill with the exceptions is better than nothing. I mean, it would protect some children, at least, but I'd like to get all those exceptions out of there. I don't disagree with you on that. Let's go about it just in a very straightforward fashion and see if we can't do that. Senator Chambers, would you be supportive of such an effort?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not yet, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not yet.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Would you ever, Senator?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When I think the time is right and I think maybe there's been enough massaging of my colleagues so that that position will be taken, I may relent.
