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amendment that would strike that provision from the bill dealing with the employee exception, strike it altogether. In order to get to hers, there are your amendment, my amendments to yours, and Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler would be willing to withdraw his and, based on his willingness to do that, I will withdraw my amendments to your amendments, and we could take a vote on yours.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: That sounds like a great idea.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then, without taking any more time in communicating with my two colleagues, I'm going to rehash what would be done. I will withdraw my amendments to Senator Quandahl's amendment, because his is up there and he can't withdraw it now we've attempted to amend it. That will then leave only Senator Beutler's amendment. And on faith and trust, I'm pulling my two amendments from Senator Quandahl's. Senator Beutler had said, if we adopt Senator Schimek's amendment, which would then be at the top, he would refile the amendment that he drafted that would integrate what Senator...I started to say Quandahl, Senator Aguilar's bill will do, and it would not contain that exemption which I hope Senator Schimek's amendment would remove. Senator Aguilar said he will support her amendment. And if we can adopt her amendment, that should mean we have enough votes to move the bill. I do not have to get the whole day. The reason I thought that would be necessary was to beat everybody down to the point where we would make a rational move on this bill. I think Senator Schimek is offering that. I can take a hard position, Senator Aguilar, and say nothing can move me, but in my mind there's always a proviso. If a greater good comes along, then the good that I can accomplish, as I'm reckoning good, a greater good comes along than the good I can achieve by taking the whole morning, I will yield. And while I'm on the floor, I want to acknowledge that I made a mistake the other day. I wrote a poem about these license plates and in the poem I said I had given a vote for one of these plates. I said I gave a vote for Senator Brashear's spirit plates.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I was the only one who voted no. So I did
