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the right thing; thought I did the wrong thing, but because I thought I did wrong, I confessed to a crime I didn't even commit. If that can happen to moi, you know how it can happen to other people. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek, on the reconsideration motion.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I want to clear my understanding...clarify my understanding, perhaps I should say, with Senator Chambers. Because I'm perfectly willing to have my amendment come up nex', but I rather understcod it that Senator Beutler would amond his amendment to incorporate what I was trying to do in my amendment. And either way is fine with me, but I just want to make sure that we're all on the same page here.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schimek, I'm still a tactician. I cannot allow Senator Beutler's amendment to get ahead of what I'm trying to do.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, if yours is adopted, then I don't have any problem with his coming up,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because we will have gotten rid of that bad part of the bill.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And then if I could ask Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler, was that your...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...understanding of how it was going to happen also?
