SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Clerk, I'd withdraw that amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schimek would move to amend with FA1452. (Legislative Journal page 540.)

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. This is a floor amendment. I did it on the spur of the moment because it seems to me that what we're really arguing about here are these exceptions. So it occurs to me that we ought to at least vote on the one I think that causes the most consternation and see how the body feels about it. So the intent of the amendment is to delete section (2)(a). In other words, on line...on lines 4 through 7 on page 5 where it says, "An employee under the age of 18 years, including agricultural workers, is engaged in the necessary discharge of the employee's duty within a truck body in space intended for merchandise or cargo." So that's...that is the essence of the amendment. I'm not going to explain it any more than that. I think you all understand what the amendment does. It deletes that exception, and you all probably have an opinion on it one way or the other. With that, Mr. President, I will...I'll yield my time to Senator Chambers, if he should want it.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers, you have 8 minutes and 40 seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I assure you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you, Senator Schimek, I will not need that much time. If this amendment is adopted, we would then be able to discuss this language in subsection (b), which talks about parades, caravans, or exhibitions. Either they can be eliminated, they can be defined, but whatever method we choose to deal with those words, that method can be applied and employed unencumbered by the concerns that have been expressed with the language that Senator Schimek is attempting to move...remove.
