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Senator Aguilar a question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Aguilar, would you yield?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Aguilar, from the very beginning you acknowledged that you had trouble with this language. Isn't that true?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, if we remove it, we are not going against what it is that you believe and what you would like to see done. Is that true?

SENATOR AGUILAR: That's very true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you are willing at this time to vote with Senator Schimek and others to remove this language.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, I am.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, that's all that I have to say. I would return any time I have to Senator Schimek, if she needs it.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek waives off on the rest of the time. Senator Baker. Senator Baker, your light is on. We're discussing the Schimek amendment.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. I need to reiterate what we've done, so far as I interpret it. We have provided an exemption for everyone going under 25 miles an hour in the back of a pickup, with Senator Quandahl's amendment. Is that not correct? I believe that's correct. Senator Quandahl, is that...would you answer a question, please?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Quandahl, would you yield?
