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Senator Quandahl, because I did not vote for that amendment because I was unsure of how to vote on that amendment. But I agree; I think the actual effect would be that there are going to be no fines imposed if you're driving under 25 miles an hour, so therefore people aren't going to worry about that. So if you're an agricultural worker, you're a detasseler on a truck, and that truck is driving under 25 miles an hour, it's probably not going to impact. The same things could be true with a parade. So we could probably get rid of both of these, (a) and (b), if we chose to. But the amendment up here is deleting section (2)(a), which just applies to agricultural workers, primarily. So with that, Mr. President, I would urge the adoption of FA1452.
