SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, I think when we passed Senator Quandahl's amendment, that's a reasonable amendment. That should cover farm workers, it should cover the other section. I was going to put an amendment in to do on page 5, lines 8 through 10, because I don't think in those...in a parade, a carnival, would be going faster than 25 miles an hour. So it's a reasonable...I think the Quandahl amendment, I think, makes the bill, in my estimation, a good piece of legislation. I don't think we need these two exceptions. I think we can pass the bill. I don't see, you know, for farm workers going over 25 miles an hour. I just can't see it. I think we're at a stage where we should adopt the amendment of Senator Schimek's. And then I'll have an amendment later on to strike the other language, so we just have...the speed, I think, is the key part of this bill. And so I hope that you would change your mind on this measure, this reconsideration that Senator Chambers had up for us. And I give the rest of the time to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Chambers, you have 3 minutes, 41 seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Hartnett. I would like to ask Senator Ray Janssen a question.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, were you distracted when the debate and the vote were taken originally on Senator Schimek's amendment?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Chambers, we all get distracted from time to time, and don't pay attention to what's going on. And I did have a few other things on my mind, and I find out now what Senator Schimek's amendment did, and I will be voting in the affirmative on the reconsideration motion.
