SENATOR RAIKES: What I'm trying to sort out for myself is whether or not this is an area that makes sense for enforcement. And maybe it does, and I'm...but I'm not yet convinced. So I guess the details are maybe a little less important to me than the general area of interest, if you will, the...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then you are opposed to the bill, period? Is that true?

SENATOR RAIKES: That's my inclination at this point, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, then that does explain your vote differently from the way I would have interpreted it, if you were saying you would be in favor of the bill only if it had that exception. Thank you, Senator Raikes. Members of the Legislature, the bill probably then won't go anyplace anyway. But I cannot take that chance. I thought Senator Schimek's amendment would be adopted. Obviously, I misjudged and miscalculated. But I won't miscalculate twice on the same bill, not intentionally. So I'm going to have to take my morning, the rest of the morning, and take at least an hour Monday when we come back, or whenever this bill comes back on the agenda. And whenever this bill is off the agenda, depending on what my mind tells me is the best for my overall strategy for the session, other bills following Senator Aguilar's may be subject to treatment. I had supported Senator Vrtiska, Cunningham, Erdman, Quandahl, et al on this LB 353, because I thought it was reasonable and it seemed that there was concern for young people. It's another one of those bills where the youngster is the one we're looking at. But I see too many other situations where the youngster's welfare is more directly implicated, and senators are voting against those interests of young people. So if in the broad sweep of things the interests of young people are going to be put down, I'm not going to agree to pick and choose where we're going to show that interest. And if it begins to appear that there's going to be concern for all children, or concern for no children, then maybe,...
