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Schimek, for bringing that amendment, and thank Senator Chambers for his reconsideration motion, because I think it's very important that you do reconsider this. If you'll stop and think about what the Quandahl amendment did, the Quandahl amendment basically takes away the need for all the other exemptions that are in there, because no parade would be traveling faster than that. You wouldn't need that in there. And as far as grandfathers driving their grandchildren around, I would say...I would question the wisdom of driving faster than 25 miles an hour. You could still take your kids to the field. You can still take your grandkids for a ride. You just have to stay under 25 miles an hour. I don't think that's too much to ask to save a few lives and prevent serious injury across the state of Nebraska. For that reason, I do ask you to reconsider your vote on that last vote taken. Thank you.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Aguilar. Senator Combs.

SENATOR COMBS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker...Mr. President and members of the body. I have been listening to the debate this morning, and I'm reminded of another quote from the Holy Bible, and that is, come and let us reason together. And I'm in the mood to reason together. I live in a rural area, and believe you me, I get really discouraged when I'm on my two-lane gravel road in the Bohemian Alps, can't see around what I'm trying to pass, and I have to follow it down the road. Seldom have I ever seen one of those vehicles going more than 25 miles an hour. So given that we have already accepted Senator Quandahl's amendment for 25 miles per hour, and I have yet to see a combine or tractor or pickup doing agricultural business going over 25 miles an hour, then I would change my not voting to a vote and support this amendment. And I ask my other reasonable senators, rural and urban, to come and let us reason together, and let's get this through. Thank you.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I too stand in support of Senator Schimek's amendment. And I did support it on the last round, even though I am considered an ag senator. I did that because I believe some
