AM2370. On line...on page 42, line 4, simply states, reinstate the stricken matter and strike the new matter.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, so we...this amendment that you're offering now will change the E & R amendment to reflect what you and I agreed on?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, that's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. I'm with you now. Thank you. That's all that I have.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Baker, would you like to close? Senator Baker waives closing. We'll now proceed to vote on AM2370 by Senator Baker. All in favor vote aye; opposed say nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Baker's amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The motion...the amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Baker would move to amend with AM2490. (Legislative Journal pages 542-550.)

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein and members. AM2490 is an attempt to streamline some of our work in the committee. We had a bill we passed last year, Senator Burling's bill, allowing for certificates of title on ATVs and minibikes and so on. There was some language that needed to be clarified by Department of Motor Vehicle. This bill...the amendment, AM2490, includes the bill number LB 860, LB 860, which was heard in Transportation Committee, advanced on a unanimous vote. And what it does, it does...it simply cleans up some language dealing with certificates of titles to the motorboats, ATVs, and minibikes, as I said, that we did adopt last year, Senator Burling's bill, and further amend some definitions of assembled ATVs and minibikes and so on. And then the other bill that
