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SENATOR ENGEL: Some of these cars that you've...maybe you accumulated an old car that you're going to rebuild and so forth, and you haven't licensed it for several years because it hasn't gone anyplace. Do you do...is that penalized...is there a penalty for that also? Because it's not on the road, it's...

SENATOR JONES: You've got to get back to where you were supposed to have licensed it, see? You know, because you've still got to pick up that, because you've got to get your tag and everything and registration, because you won't have that either. So that...and you've got to pay all the back tax too, see?

SENATOR ENGEL: I guess what I was going to tell you, you go ahead and you go down and you title it, you know, so that you get your title and so forth. And then it goes into storage, and maybe it might be in storage for five years while you're rebuilding it. Is there a penalty there for whatever that might...?

SENATOR JONES: I don't know if you can get something at the courthouse that say it's not in use. I don't know. I haven't answered that question. I probably can't answer it right.

SENATOR ENGEL: Okay. Well, thank you.

SENATOR JONES: Senator Wehrbein might have the answer to that.

SENATOR ENGEL: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I have another amendment on that that's going to speak a little more to that, Senator. But the way it is now, you can file an affidavit, in theory. And if it truly is in storage, is truly not being used, you can avoid those. And I have an amendment coming up in AM2354 that's going to speak to that issue, because I think...I found out...I was going to talk
