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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR JONES: What your amendment actually does, then, is force the people, if they want to leave a vehicle set for a long time, to file an affidavit, and if they don't file it, well, then we'll...we can get all the back taxes and...?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's right. Or if they just casually state that, when they go in, well, I had that on blocks, and...well, if somebody happens to see them driving...I mean, these things are not unique, obviously, out there. And so it's as a penalty also for falsely stating that they have been on blocks, when actually they're not.

SENATOR JONES: Okay. Well, I'm going to support your amendment because I think it tightens it up a little bit and makes the bill a little better then. And I think...so I think I'll support your amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Yeah, thank you, member...Mr. President. I'd like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question, I guess.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, would you yield?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR LOUDEN: In some areas, like in ranch countries, and that sort of thing, they don't always license these vehicles. Now, you have to pay the taxes on them all the time, but if you don't drive them on public roads, you don't have to license them. Does this amendment affect that, and will that make a difference on how that's done out there? Will those people have to sign an affidavit to show that they have a licensed vehicle? Because they already enter it as...on the tax as taxes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm...I would have to have to check that. I don't know how that affects that...right of the top of my head,
