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I don't know that that would affect it, Senator Louden. I wasn't aware that that was...there...would they would be in as an off-road vehicle, then?

SENATOR LOUDEN: No, there's...there will be several ranch pickups around through the Sandhills that are never licensed to drive on the highway. You have to pay the county taxes and that sort of thing on them, but you don't have to have a license plate on a...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, the best...

SENATOR LOUDEN: ...vehicle...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...answer I would have--I'm not being an expert here--that if you're not registering them now and doing it and paying the taxes, then I don't know that this changes that.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I would like to just have a little dialog with Senator Wehrbein, if he would be willing.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: I'll give you an example of what could happen, and how would this affect with...if this was passed. I've got a 1935 Chevy truck that's in the shed. I haven't licensed this since 1979. And when we pull it out this summer to use it again and rework it, and I wanted to license it, what will happen with this?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Do you have the affidavits filed?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: No.
