bill. I'm going to read the language into the record. My amendment says that on page 20, in lines 5 through 8, remove the following language: "The license of a body art facility that has been revoked for any reason may not be reinstated. An original application for licensure shall be submitted and approved before such facility may reopen for business." Now what it is saying, that a revoked license cannot be reinstated but that same person, or anybody else, can apply for a new license. I think that is redundant and unnecessary. I'm going to listen to the discussion to see whether or not my and Senator Bourne's opinion is correct. It should not require an entire process of obtaining a license when a license for one of these facilities has been revoked. Remember, the revocation is of the license of the facility, not of the individual. Let's say that the department went into the facility and found, to use Senator Bourne's example, that it was not as clean as it needed to be, or some other activity that would result in the revocation of the license. A person may argue that the facility operator was given the opportunity to correct and rectify that problem. That's not in the bill. None of those theoretical discussions are in the bill. The department is given the authority to draft rules and regulations, so we don't know what those rules and regulations would be. So a statute, in my opinion, ought to set boundaries outside of which the department cannot stray when drafting rules and regulations. I do not see where the public interests would be harmed if you allowed a facility whose license had been revoked to have that revocation removed and the license reinstated. I'd like to ask Senator Baker a question. Oh, he's not here. Is there somebody who is on the Transportation Committee in the Chamber? This is almost like when somebody says, is there a doctor in the house, and you're talking about medical malpractice insurance. "Dr." Stuthman raised his hand. Oh, I meant, Senator Stuthman, would you answer a question, if you know the answer? I will ask it.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Stuthman, never having had my license to drive revoked, or even close, I really don't know the answer to this question. If my license is revoked, do I simply pay the reinstatement fee, or do I have to go and take the whole panoply
