a...or they should be able to purchase an ongoing business without having to go through the whole process of a new license. I have a couple other questions and when I'm next able to speak I'll ask Senator Stuhr about those. Again, I support the bill, I support Senator Chambers' amendment, and I support the willingness of Senator Stuhr and Senator Jensen to improving the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I hope you all understand that we are really cutting new ground here and that I do appreciate the discussion that we have had and the points that Senator Bourne has brought forward, and also Senator Chambers. In regards to the number of hours, we are certainly willing to work on that and look at the grandfather clause, and if we need to make some adjustments. As we said, and Senator Jensen said, we picked that number of hours just rather arbitrarily. I'm not sure that we even need a number of hours, so we could certainly...and I would like to work, actually, between now and Select File on that particular issue. Also, Senator Chambers brings the...to our attention, and Senator Bourne, on the Uniform Licensing Act, whether this does apply to the Cosmetology Act. Again, we'd be certainly willing to work in that area. I do think that we need to find a balance in the amount of regulation. It is never our intent to put people out of business, but we do want reputable artists practicing in this business because it does affect the health and safety of the members of the public. So with that, I believe I'll turn the rest of my time to Senator Chambers, because I know that he has some comments. Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Senator Bourne made a point about Section 40, which is the one immediately below the language I'm trying to remove with my amendment. I had told Senator Stuhr that I think we need a little more discussion of the bill. Then I will pull my amendment and we will work on that between now and the time the
