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plant at Nebraska City?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. Now is this going to...are we going to be back in the near future and revisiting the emissions and how much power you can generate from larger generators? I know some of the emission is based on that. This bill doesn't do anything with restructuring of the emission.

SENATOR SCHROCK: No, it does not, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. I see some from OPPD back there shaking their head in the negative. So is there anything in your committee that is looking at something like that?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yeah, we have an emissions bill that's on Select File that increases the fees to cover the cost of the program.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. Thank you, Senator Schrock. I am particularly concerned about that because we do have some generating facilities throughout the state that are keeping the cost of power down, and I don't want to see anything come along that would raise those costs, especially on the emission. Thank you, Senator Schrock. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Chambers, Natural Resources Committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to go now to the bill itself. Senator Schrock, on page 2 of the bill I'm going to tell you what I think the language is saying in Section 1. This bill relates to the purchase of power by these various entities that are listed in Section 1. They can range from a city and a public power district, to a joint entity formed under the Interlocal Cooperation Act, correct?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock.
