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to do this same...they'll want to go this same route.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does that mean that NPPD and OPPD may be collaborating on a project and that's how you get two power generators out of it?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's correct, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But if that doesn't happen, the project of OPPD is deemed to be the project of one power generator. Is that correct?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm beginning to see the light, but I haven't seen it all yet, so when my light is recognized, I will ask a question or two again. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh. Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Schrock, the worst thing that could happen...first of all, does OPPD need any authority under the statute to double the output of this plant that we've been discussing?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Chambers, near as I knew, all they need is the approval of the Power Review Board.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So this statute is not needed for that purpose.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And this statute does not guarantee the approval of the Power Review Board.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Not saying that those things will or won't happen, but just so I can get an understanding. We're talking here about a project that involves two or more power
