with me as to what language I'm striking. The language in the amendment isn't before us, but it's being put onto the gadget. My amendment would strike and show as stricken "any organization created exclusively for religious purposes." I would like to strike that from the law. I'd like to ask Senator Byars a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Byars, would you respond?

SENATOR BYARS: I will yield.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Byars, this amendment I'm sure catches you off guard because there was no reason for you or anybody else to anticipate that it would be offered. Do you agree with that?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now that I tell you that it is going to be on the gadget and that I'm serious about it, would you support such an amendment?
