SENATOR LOUDEN: What it does is that anyone that is drawing Social Security will still be able to draw their full unemployment benefit insurance.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And currently that is...if you're on Social Security, that is taken into consideration to reduce the amount of unemployment compensation that you draw. Is that true?

SENATOR LOUDEN: That's true. I think half of your Social...your Social Security weekly benefit is divided in half, and that much is deducted from your unemployment benefit.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Who would be opposed to your amendment based on when it was presented before the committee, because I was not there when it was heard either? Did anybody oppose it?

SENATOR LOUDEN: I...you'd have to ask Senator Vrtiska. As far as I knew, no one opposed it at the committee hearing when I discussed it at the hearing, but it was just put up as an amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. That's all that I need.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Cunningham.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. I have a response for Senator Aguilar,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: ...if he would, Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Is that a question, Senator Cunningham?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: I just want to read something to you. An employee has good cause for voluntarily leaving employment if the employee's decision to leave is prompted by a circumstance which has some justifiably reasonable connection with or relation to the conditions of the employment. So that would answer that a little bit. I would also tell you that the
