Unemployment Trust Fund has been dropping drastically and there was just a large rate increase announced for this year. Now before the rate increase, last year we took in \$93.5 million, using a 9.5 percent rate table. It went up to 10.5 percent and this year we are going to take in \$129.6 million, which means approximately \$36 million increase in what businesses are having to pay into unemployment this year. And I would read to you some of the examples. This was a nursing home in Stanton, Nebraska, and here's some of the examples that he gave. He had an employee observed handling a resident inappropriately; that employee was terminated from her position as a nurse's aide. Under State Department of Health Regulations, an administrator that does not remove an employee from the establishment for abuse to a client can have his license put on suspension or removed, depending on the severity of the case. This employee, then, was terminated and, after the eight weeks of disqualification, received \$3,366 from Stanton Health Care Center. Now I want to stress that there is another side to unemployment insurance. A lot of public entities don't buy into the pool like regular businesses do, but when they have employees that collect unemployment, they have to pay that in directly. So a lot of, I assume, hospitals, nonprofits, and nursing homes, and schools, those types of places, they pay in directly. This nursing center also had an employee. This employee stated she was not making enough money, so she quit her employment. It cost the health care center \$384. They had an employee that was terminated after showing her boyfriend how to get into the computer system and change the data. That employee received \$2,660. She had an employee that was working in the office and she told them she was quitting to stay home with her children and she was expecting another child also. She collected \$1,924. Had an employee had difficulty with a pregnancy so she quit her job, which is understandable, but she never came back again after that baby was born. She collected \$1,792. Now in the last three quarters, it said, Stanton Health Care Center has paid out \$13,068.81 for unemployment insurance, and they said they had several other claims where they had people laid off because of declining census and they needed to pay unemployment insurance in those cases. And that is not what this bill is about. This bill is only for people who quit on their own free will without good cause. And you might go to
