SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Now I don't have to try to speak so rapidly. The President is named G.W. Bush, and he persuaded many Americans that Saddam Hussein had weapons of mass destruction. Now he's trying to say, well, he did the best he could with what he had to work with. But what I remember--and a lot of people in here don't, and I talked about it at the time--I watched him sneer, I watched him smirk, I listened to his arrogant cowboy boasting about how they were going to go in and get these weapons. I watched, as I've stated before, him completely humiliate and degrade Colin Powell by making him go before the UN and say things he knew were not true. But that's Powell's fault. Powell is a grown man. I referred to Powell as an Uncle Tom. I have now seen white people writing columns in national publications about how Powell has been demeaned, degraded, and emasculated. Those are words of my choosing to describe bluntly and without embellishment what has happened to this man. So when Bush now wants to change the basis for going to war, it's like cops conducting an illegal search with an invalid warrant. Then when they find something, they want to say, oh, well, yeah, we didn't have a warrant, we didn't know that was there, but now we want to change the reason we went in and make it all right. Well, the fruit from the poison tree cannot be used in a prosecution. In the same way that an invalid warrant cannot be cured after the fact, Bush wants to change the warrant. He changes his position.
