And I'm struggling as to what to do with Senator Louden's amendment, because I see those retired folks, while you can argue that that's not income, they're still getting some money in the door to help...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...pay their bills, versus other folks.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion, Senator Janssen, followed by Senator Chambers and others.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature. Now, we stand here, all of us, arguing about things that a minority of the people create for the majority. Now, it's...there are people that abuse the system. And it makes it tough for the majority of the people. And you know, and you look at Social Security, and I believe, you know, that Social Security is like any other retirement plan. You know, and down on page 21 (sic) of the bill--I'm trying to get up to speed with this here--no deduction shall be made for any benefit received under supplemental unemployment benefit plan described in this subsection. So I believe that we...Social Security is one of those...thank goodness we have it. You know, when you're young you're paying into that and you think, gosh, you know, how long am I going to have to pay into that thing? But tell you, when you get to be my age, and Senator Burling, and Senator Vrtiska's age, Senator Hartnett, Senator Chambers--he's with the elite crew now also--you know, it's a pretty good thing. You know, you think I'm paying into this thing all my life, and I'll probably never see any of that return. But it happens, for you younger people, it happens a lot quicker than you think. So I'm going to be watching how this goes. And I want to express on you that unemployment insurance is there for a need. And you know, it's too bad that sometimes those needs strike people more often than others. But it's there. It's a safety net, and I believe we should keep it there. I mean, it's something that we need to have for unfortunate people who for one reason or
