SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I wanted to pursue a little bit about what Senator Bourne was talking about in that last statement. What you're saying is, if you've been on active duty and return home, that's when you would be entitled to unemployment under your scenario, assuming the three conditions that you talked about were met?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That's right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Is that what you're saying?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Most would be entitled to reemployment in the job in which they had been serving.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But if they're not, under the conditions that there's no longer employment available, and that type of thing, then...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...because of circumstances, then they would be entitled to unemployment? That's...that was really what I punched my light for.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'd like to ask Senator Louden a question too, if I may, Senator Cudaback. Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Louden, would you respond?

SENATOR LOUDEN: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Are the primary areas you're talking about, Senator Louden, seasonal work, that have worked, say, for a summer job and then are laid off for the winter and move on unemployment?

SENATOR LOUDEN: In the ones that have contacted me, that's usually what they did. They worked at some...worked through the
