and that's language that Senator Cunningham did not eliminate. So if you're going to have the maximum punishment for every case, why do you keep that language which says each case based on the seriousness of the offense? Shouldn't that be stricken? Because it doesn't matter what the seriousness is now; they all get the same maximum punishment.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, it's not my bill, and I suggest you talk to Senator Cunningham, because I support what he's done, but it's his bill, and how he wants to change it or make additions or subtractions is his choice.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Vrtiska, if you were very upset about something that was going on, and your wife had just put a big ham on the table, would you talk to that ham about what you're upset about?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No. Thank you. That's why I won't talk to Senator Cunningham further, because I did try to talk to him earlier, and I got nowhere. I'd like to ask Senator Cunningham a question, in the few seconds I have left.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Yes, I would.
