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because that is an aberration. That's why you mentioned it. It's so out of the ordinary. That would...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...be hard for somebody to say that this person should be given a break. But let's take the general run...

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, so now you're going to cut me off. Well, if that's the way you want to do it, it's your time. Okay.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: That's what you do to me, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Because I can get away with it.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, now I'm doing it to you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, why, though (laugh)...

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: But out of...gentleman that I am, Senator Chambers, go ahead and finish.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How much time does he have left, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Well, now it's about 30 seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Cunningham, in the spirit of collegiality, I'll return to you whatever time remains.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: And with the rest of the time, Senator Cudaback, it's yours.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Thank you, Mr. President. I yield my time to Senator Chambers.
