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motor vehicle taxes. That's the only penalty now that remains in my amendments or in the bill that I'm aware of.

SENATOR JONES: Yes. So the interest would just be on the taxes. It wouldn't be on the registration on a deal like that.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, that's right.

SENATOR JONES: And also your next amendment then explains that 14 percent a little bit better then.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The next amendment simply explains that when all of these things are true, that is they haven't been paid, then the interest penalty is due. It's more of a clarification. It's more than a technical amendment. E & R brought it to my attention it's a little more than technical, and that's why I am not calling it a technical amendment, but it's a clarifying amendment on what we have been doing, the next one, not this one.

SENATOR JONES: Yes. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. This here affidavit is a little bit...I don't know for sure about it, but I think I'm going to support it and go ahead and move the bill forward that way. So I'm more concerned about the next amendment coming up, which I had something to do with, the 14 percent interest on the tax itself. So thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Jones a question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Jones, would you yield, please.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jones, I think you displayed a bit of arrogance in your last comment and I think you slapped me across the chops. If I understood you correctly, you said you were going to support this amendment, then move the bill right along. Is that what you said?
