SENATOR JONES: (Laugh) Well, we've got to get by a couple more amendments after that first before I do that, but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you think you're going to just move the bill right along over my opposition, just like a pop of the finger. Is that what you think?

SENATOR JONES: Well, I hope to, but I wouldn't guarantee that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, Senator Jones, what have you learned that none of my other colleagues nor I have been aware of, namely, how to just overcome my opposition by saying that you're going to overcome it? What has happened that makes you feel that to be the case on this bill?

SENATOR JONES: Well, I think it's something that is wanted and needed clear across the state, and I think everybody is interested in doing it, going from three to six. And I think they would like to see that happen because you and I both know that the plates don't wear out and it's really not cutting down much on what they get, because, to start out with, it's \$2.50 apiece per plate right now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm not talking about the underlying principle of the bill. That is no problem.

SENATOR JONES: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When this bill was being discussed in the committee, when people came to testify on the bill during the committee hearing, was there any mention made of penalties on taxes that may be due as a result of a late registration? Was that discussed during the hearing?

SENATOR JONES: No, it wasn't.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So that amendment that we attached did not have a hearing. Is that right?

SENATOR JONES: That's right.
