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what would happen there. I'm glad that I researched this, but, Senator Wehrbein, would you be willing to answer a question?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Senator Wehrbein,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: ...in your conversation the other day you stated that, you know, that there had to be an affidavit on file. Did you realize that you just file that when you want to relicense it?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah, if I said it had to be on file, I misstated. That's...your...what you said is correct.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And that's the way I understood it, too.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. Thank you. Because I guess I understood it that would be, you know, that you had to have it on file the years that you were not using the vehicle, but I think the way I found it to be and the way you understand it now, too, is that it needs to be something on file so that there is proof that you didn't have to pay the taxes for those prior years. Correct?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's correct. I was going to say something and we ran out of time on that, but I did understand it the way you said it at the time, and I didn't have a chance to correct.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. Okay. Thank you. And I'll return the balance of my time to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Senator Schimek, on the motion to recommit to committee.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you. Mr. President, I'd like to give my time to Senator Chambers.
