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of one of the worst judges who ever sat the bench in Nebraska. Others knew about his misconduct, but nobody tried to do anything about it. I have obtained reprimands on judges. One of them used the F-word toward a female attorney in chambers, and the court administrator at that time and apparently the Judicial Qualifications Commission didn't think that was serious enough to do anything, and that was supposed to be the end of it. But it was not the end of it as far as I was concerned. And I stated that something was going to be done to that judge...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein, followed by Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein, on the motion to recommit.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, I haven't decided on the recommit. I'm just going to explain my position. I was trying to make a bill that I was going to vote against because I thought it was too much loss in money. I thought I'd try to make it improved. I don't know whether I want to say as strong as to make a bad bill better. I don't want to argue with the six-year license plates, but I think we lose five years of increased registrations, because we have history to prove that. So I was simply trying to do that. Using the penalty phase, we discovered that it is simpler and I was bowing to some conversations I had with county treasurers to go with the interest instead of having a penalty. That solved two things. It made it easier to figure interest, because it becomes just like it is done on real estate delinquency. That's first. Second, that money then, instead of going to the school fund, would go back into the county general, which is then distributed...the money is distributed for the motor vehicle taxes, which goes to counties, schools, NRDs. It has that distribution pattern. So the money goes to those that are losing it by a lack of registration, so I felt it was obvious. Senator Chambers is right. Technically it's not had a hearing. I'll leave it up to the body what you want to do. I'm perfectly willing to withdraw the bill or withdraw my amendments to try to get us back. We do have to take off the interest rate that Senator Jones had put in, in another amendment, to get it back to where Senator Chambers wants. I can go back to the original
