I'm not above attempting to amend a bill on the floor to raise a tax, but I will tell you what I'm doing. I will characterize it as what it is, and then I will fight to try to get it done. And somebody would probably say, it hasn't had a hearing, and I would have to agree, and that might be a way for the body to avoid having to confront the issue. I don't fault Senator Wehrbein for what he did. I'm faulting myself. I was not attentive, but I'm going to rectify that error. And if it takes me a long time to do it, I will take a long time. When we're two months down the line from here in the session, what we do here today, as Abraham Lincoln said, will be little noted nor long remembered. But since I can only live in the instant, what is happening in this instant is important to me.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I think it is important in terms of maybe setting a tone for how we're going to deal with our financial crises as we come face to face with them. I will support tax increases if necessary, and I may offer some tax increases, but I will not do it in this manner. I don't see anything underhanded about what Senator Wehrbein did. He was above board and we discussed it and I engaged in the discussion, so I don't want anybody to get the impression from anything that I say that I fault Senator Wehrbein for what he did. I applaud him for his ability to overcome my opposition...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...so easily. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Vrtiska, on the motion to recommit to committee.
