be any loss of revenue in the 2005 calendar year, since it's the renewal of the...or changing of the license plates. That gives us that window of opportunity. We could accomplish what everyone, I think, is trying to do here, and that's have a hearing, see where we go with it. At the same time, we can get LB 279 adopted this year and no harm done. So I would encourage people to...and we'll be talking off the mike, trying to get these amendments piled...withdrawn, I'm sorry, sorry, the motion to recommit withdrawn and the amendments up on the board withdrawn. Then we'll have...offer an amendment I think is being filed right now to strike the amendments we had adopted onto the bill prior to this. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Chambers, and this will be your third time, as you know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Baker. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein, Senator Jones, and everybody who's working on this issue. I'd like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question or two, if he is available.
