SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. The reason I wanted that on the record, I don't want to make it appear that I'm blindsiding Senator Wehrbein. Had I not listened so carefully to what he was saying and being in agreement with it, maybe we wouldn't be here with this argument today because maybe I could have fought successfully against the adoption of his amendment. Sometimes when you get caught in the trap that I find myself in, as the oldest member of the Legislature, you begin to think in a way that could be called institutional. You consider what might be best in the long run for the Legislature when we are undertaking the enactment of laws. And it would be better, by far, if a bill like this were to be put into law, that it contain provisions that would address the possible loss of revenue based on late registrations. But that is not the form that the bill was in. I let my institutional thinking override my lawmaking awareness, and that amendment should not have been adopted. What I'm doing is what I will continue to do when I think something has occurred which ought not to have taken place. The Legislature is like a debating society. We are supposed to be deliberative, and if a mistake is made Monday and we become aware that it was made Tuesday, when the bill comes before us again Wednesday there must be a correcting of the mistake. It is seldom that a person has proceeded so far down the wrong path that he or she cannot turn around, retrace those steps, and get on to the right path. I think if we remove those amendments that were adopted the other day we will be on the right path. The underlying bill is not going to be harmed at all. It will remain intact. The county people will be getting what they wanted from the bill. What they will not get is a bonus to which, in my mind, they were not entitled to, but which Senator Wehrbein was going to provide them with. I'd like to ask Senator Jones a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jones, would you yield?

SENATOR JONES: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jones, did you file a motion to do something about removing those amendments?
