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FLOOR DEBATE

February 11, 2004 LB 270

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the motion to adopt E & R amendments to LB 270. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, first motion I have is from Senator Brashear, MO390.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear, you're recognized to open on your motion, MO390, to LB 270. Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Clerk, I'd like to withdraw that motion, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator...now I have MO391, which is essentially a similar motion to what you just withdrew.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Which I would ask respectfully to withdraw also.

CLERK: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn also. Thank you, Senator Brashear.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to amend, AM2215. (Legislative Journal page 439.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, to open on AM2215 to LB 270. AM2215. Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler, did you...?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, Senator Cudaback. Just bringing it up on my screen. Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, you may recall that a portion of the bill is the Crime Victims Reparation Act, which provides a number of things with regard to the rights of victims, with respect to information that they can have along the way. That information goes to a number of processes, including court processes, but also with respect to notification, for example, of when prisoners have escaped. And
