February 11, 2004 LB 559

SENATOR MOSSEY: Mr. President, I move the adoption of E & R amendments to LB 559.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 559. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment I have to the bill, Senator Baker, AM2495. I have a note, Senator, you want to withdraw AM2495.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: That's correct.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn.

SENATOR BAKER: And substitute FA1458. (Legislative Journal page 600.)

CLERK: I'm sorry. Yes, that's right, Senator. That was my note here. Senator Baker would like to withdraw AM2495 and substitute FA1458, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: No objection, so ordered. Senator Baker, you're recognized to open on that amendment.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. FA1458 is the same as the amendment that was withdrawn, AM2495. It's just that it was...AM2495 was drafted to the bill, and it should have been drafted to the E & R amendments. So what FA1458 does is, on page 5, if you want to follow along, it reinstates the stricken matter and strikes the...and withdraws...strikes the new matter, reinstates the stricken matter, which, if you want to follow along there, it just says that any individual under the age of 18 years applying for an operator's license or a state identification card shall provide a certificated copy of his or her birth certificate. And it goes on there. It strikes the language. It just looks to me to be surplus language in there. And that's on page 5. On page 7, there's lines 5, 9, 15, 23, all have the same changes on them, and it strikes
