SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. So it would say "Any individual under the age of eighteen years applying for an operator's license or a state identification card shall provide a certified copy of his or her birth certificate, a certified birth registration, or other reliable proof of his or her identity and age accompanied by a certification signed by a parent or guardian explaining the inability to produce a copy of such birth certificate."

SENATOR BAKER: We're not taking that language out in lines 6 through 8. That's staying in there. That just further clarifies, in lieu of this certified copy of the birth certificate or certified birth registration, the applicant shall furnish one other reliable form of documentation providing proof. We're leaving...

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. So...

SENATOR BAKER: ...that language in, in lines 6 through 8.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. I'm just...again, I'm trying to clarify. Those floor amendments are a little difficult to read, you know, especially when you're taking out language that's previously been inserted, and going back to the way it was. So what you...what it will say, any individual under the age of 18 shall provide a certified copy of his or her birth certificate, and then it...or a certified birth registration. Then it says, if one of those is not available, then in lieu of certified copy of the birth certificate, the applicant shall furnish one other reliable form of documentation providing proof of his or her identity. That's what it would say?

SENATOR BAKER: Right. It gives some flexibility to that applicant, is what it's doing. Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: I think you're right. So again, the way I read it, if they don't have a certified birth certificate, they could provide some other reliable form of documentation providing proof of his or her identity and age?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes. And I think that includes some things like
