baptismal certificates from a church, and things like that.

SENATOR BOURNE: But it would have to be...if that individual is a minor, it would have to be accompanied by a...well, it doesn't say that, Senator Baker. Okay. If...the way I read it...okay, in lieu of a certified copy of birth certificate or a certified birth registration, the applicant shall furnish one other reliable form of documentation providing proof of his or her identity and age, accompanied by a certification signed by a parent or guardian explaining the inability to produce a copy of a birth certificate or certified birth registration. So if I go to get a driver's license and I can't find my birth certificate, my parents, even though I'm an older individual, my parents would still have to submit a certification?

SENATOR BAKER: This is only if you're under 18, Senator Bourne. I think you're over that.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. I...no, I see what you're saying. I'm just trying to get the clarity, because we've had...we've gone back and forth on this issue a lot, and I think there was some confusion, at least on General File, as to what was required by the federal law and what isn't. So I just want to make sure that if you're under 18, if you don't have a birth certificate, you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...have another way to get the driver's license.

SENATOR BAKER: That's right.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: That's right.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: Only if you're under 18 do you have to follow this.
