SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, would you yield?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I will.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Baker, being as this bill is up this morning, it brought to my attention a conversation I had this morning with one of my constituents, who said his father had decided that he shouldn't be driving anymore, and he wanted to give up his driver's license. He went to the county treasurer and asked...he told her, he said, I want to turn my driver's license in. I shouldn't be driving anymore. Would you give me an identification card? Because he said, if I give my driver's license up, I'm not going to have any more identification. And, well, yes, but it's going to cost you. No, he said, I'm giving you my driver's license. It's paid for. Why can't you give me an identification card? What do they cost? What would be involved there? Now, you're talking about a person probably in his eighties who decides he's a menace on the road and doesn't need that driver's license, doesn't want it with him anymore. He wants to give it up. What would an identification card cost?

SENATOR BAKER: Well, it's going to be \$23.75 for an identification card. And I...my reply to him would be, hang on to the driver's license, rather than turn it in, and use that as his ID. He doesn't have to drive just because he has a driver's license. I'd hang on to it, rather than spend the money for a new ID card, because they're rather...

SENATOR JANSSEN: But that may be tempting, may be tempting.

SENATOR BAKER: ...they're rather expensive. They're \$23.75, I believe, just off the top of my head.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Do you have to renew those identification cards then?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, you do. Yes, you do. You have to renew them just like a driver's license.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That seems strange.
