rolls out. And I know that the department and the people involved are very sincere in their effort to make this work and make it work well, and that if there are problems and they need legislative remedy, I think I can speak for them and say that they will be the first to come forward, because the integrity of these systems is extremely important to the confidence that people have in making those decisions, and for the professionals who work with the families. It's a huge decision. I don't know if any of you have been in the situation where you've had to make decisions about people who are dying or near death. And when you know ahead of time what their wishes are, it makes all the difference. I've had to make that decision twice, and not ever been able to get the...not on organ donation, but on whether to code and no-code. Those decisions are better made by the individual and shared with family members. And those are tough, tough decisions to make, whether you decide to let a person go or to try to put other medical remedies in place. In these situations, the person is going to die anyway, and it's a question of whether to donate those organs to someone else. Those are hard, hard decisions to make in a short time frame, under a lot of stress from...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...just having this situation come before them. But it's an opportunity for us as a state to move forward and be better able to help those families make all those decisions, and the person themselves make that decision for their families. And this is a very important part. And I thank Senator Schrock for bringing the bill last time, that set this in motion last year, and Senator Bourne for prioritizing the dollar donation bill that I introduced a few years ago. So this is just another piece that will help make this state in a better situation to help people with those decisions. Thank you.
